Share-out: 2019 Mini Grant recipient: Willapa Players - Haunted Hannan Playhouse	<p>A little history on the Hannan Playhouse! The first play that the Willapa Players put on was in the 30's, where a play was put on almost every year up until 1996. Since then, these plays have occurred annually. In 1986 the Willapa Players moved their production into the Hannan Playhouse. The Haunted Hannan production marked the 15-year anniversary of the Hannah Playhouse!</p> <p>Throughout the year, the Hannah Playhouse has used generous grant funding to continue operation. R2R's \$400 Mini Grant helped tremendously! However, a local Church has now pledged funds that will keep their operations funded moving forward.</p> <p>Over 30 volunteers were involved in the Haunted Hannah production. Youth wrote thank you notes expressing their gratitude, and sharing how this experience has helped them grow, including but not limited to increasing confidence.</p> <p>Their next play, Betty the Yetty, is an adult comedy playing the 2nd and 3rd weekend in March. There will be a showing every Friday and Saturday night at 7:00pm, and a matinee on Sunday at 2:00pm. Tickets are \$12 for adults/\$10 for seniors. <p>Resiliency Rockstar - Pacific County Family Resource Navigators (Kathryn Staats, Nichole Page and Liliana Ayala).</p>	<p>Award presented by Jessica Verboomen and received by Kathryn Staats, Nichole Page and Liliana Ayala). Here is a synopsis of what Jessica had to say!</p> <p>Since accepting their positions, Kat, Nichole and Liliana have taken on a lot, and handled everything our other school staff did not have the time for. The things that our students have needed have always been there, but our school staff did not have the time necessary to truly give them the attention and resources they truly needed - this is undoubtedly a full-time job. Nichole, in particular, is currently working at a Family Resources Navigator and the Prevention Intervention Specialist at the Valley school.</p> <p>When our Family Resource Navigators first began, there was not real job description for them. Not only that, but they started during summer when school was not in session. Rather than spending this time training, they began meeting to put together multiple resources for our students. These include, but are not limited to, clothing closets, hygiene packs, haircuts, and more.</p> <p>These amazing ladies meet with students and go out into the community to gather any and all resources they need to help them. This could be anything from a cup-o-noodles to driving them to a doctor's appointment. Having them at our schools has met this needs for our students in a great way. As you look at other schools who do not have Family Resources Navigators, you can really see the huge difference this point of contact has had on our students.</p> <p>Nichole shared a heartwarming story that took place earlier today. A parent had come to her to ask for prom attire for her son. Several students came up to her and shared that they were already in the process of getting together his prom attire, and are currently working on hemming the pants. 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<p>Monthly Reports - Drug Buster Squad</p>	<p>They are currently working with the 6th grade teachers (Ms. Dulap and Ms. Beatty, on scheduling Slick Tracy. Currently, DBS is working on vaping presentation targeted at the younger kids. As they were discussing how to conduct this presentation without the vulgarity inappropriate for the younger kids, they came up with an alternative.</p> <p>The DBS squad would like to help implement Slick Tracy to begin mentoring the 6th graders and build that relationship. They would like to take 5-10 minutes at the end of the curriculum series to do a small presentation. Their goal: focus on the things they wish THEY knew when they were in 6th grade, and build those relationships they wish THEY had.</p> <p>Rachelle is still in training and will eventually take over DBS. Jessica will be there to mentor her until the end of the school year (at the very least).
