Share Outs	<p>Judy Dunne - Census 2020</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Judy presented about the 2020 census and how important it is to respond. • Pacific County is among the lowest in the US with response rates. • The data collected from the Census determines how much federal dollars we will get for the next 10 years. • All of the data collected is safe and secure. <p>Darian Johnson - Youth Homelessness Demonstration Project (YHDP)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The YHDP program provides homeless youth and young adults with assistance and housing. • Pacific County has two different programs within YHDP; Supportive Services Only and Rapid Rehousing. • In order to be eligible for the Supportive Services Only program, youth need to be 16 - 18 years old and living with natural supports. Youth on this program get a food allowance to help offset additional food costs for the program. • To be eligible for the Rapid Rehousing program, young adults need to be 18 - 24 years old and have a criminal record.
